1. In the six days of operations from the U.S.S. SUWANNEE, TBF planes of VC-60 flew a total of 35 sorties and SBD-5 planes flew a total of 18 sorties. No enemy aircraft were encountered. There were no losses, either operational or from enemy action.

2. Equipment functioned satisfactorily with the exception of difficulties experienced with the Mk. 50 Mod 3 wing bomb rack on the SBD-5s. On all strikes, at least one plane returned to the ship with at least one 100 pound bomb which failed to release. In all cases when the electrical release did not function, the manual releases were used, but still in some cases the bomb did not release. When later tested on deck, both with and without bombs, the racks worked properly suggesting that there is some force keeping the bomb from releasing when the aircraft is in a nose down position. The squadron ordnance officer suggests that a wing nut be used to allow the sway braces a greater freedom of action. In the present locking system vibrations seem to loosen the nuts holding the sway braces which in turn allows the bomb to swing loosely and thereby foul the release mechanism.
