MORRISSEY, Robert W., PhM3c - - On 25 October, Morrissey was injured by the blast from the explosion while on the main deck. Although his injuries were serious and painful, he persisted in caring for the wounded, ignoring his own injuries, until further help came.

DISESSA, Peter J., RMLc - - On 26 October, DiSessa, with the Communications Department badly decimated, immediately set up temporary equipment without direction, organized the men in the department and was already functioning when ordered to make preparations to do so.

VINCENT, Daniel E., MM2c - - On 25 October, Vincent coolly threw overboard a flaming gas drum.

Lieutenant Commander VINCENT - - Lt.Comdr. Vincent on 26 October played a hose on TBM No. 85, although aware it contained depth bombs. Lt(jg) Sobel, Bomb Disposal Officer, soon after disposed of the charges.

SUMTER, James (none), StM2c - - On 26 October Sumter was forced overboard by the flames on the forecastle, swam without a life jacket and towed a wounded Chief Petty Officer to a nearby raft.

Subject: Preparedness for battle, recommendations derived.

1.
 - (a) Mattresses, pillows, and sheets should be provided in the wardroom so that it can be made into an emergency ward.
 - (b) The C.P.O. Quarters should be made an additional Battle Dressing Station and medical personnel should be increased by 3 men to provide for manning this station.
 - (c) Medical supplies should be increased, particularly Plasma, Saline, Burn Dressings, and Stokes stretchers.
 - (d) Well protected storage lockers or additional state-rooms should be distributed at several places throughout the ship.
 - (e) All corpsmen should be instructed in the technique of intravenous medications before being sent to sea.
 - (f) The entire crew should be regularly instructed and trained in simple First Aid and Stretcher Bearing, and all officers should be trained in Morphine administration and infusion technique.
 - (g) The Chaplain and Medical Department should work out plans in advance for caring for and identifying the dead.
 - (h) Regulations concerning identification tags should be rigidly enforced.
 - (i) Life jacket lockers should be placed at each battle station with extra jackets.
 - (j) All personnel should be flat on deck at each General Quarters, except those whose duties absolutely demand their being upright, and all should wear flash-proof clothing at each General Quarters.

PHOTOGRAPHS, LEYTE OPERATION.

1. Two enemy VF make run on SANGAMON, returning for second time. AA fire is not accurate, as splashes show. 20 October.
2. One has turned off and is out of picture. This fighter-bomber hopped over SANGAMON and is going away fast. Picture from bridge off SUWANNEE fantail.
3. AA fire intensifies as plane gets lower on water; smoke from fantail 40 mm "quads" is evident.
4. Smoke indicates that is all for that one.
5. Attack on SANTEE. Plane has already hit ship; note splashes caused by its strafing just before it hit. 25 October.
6. Another view of SANTEE attack.
7. SANGAMON attack. Plane missed, deflected from target by only 5-inch shell fired by SUWANNEE, and plunged into water off SANGAMON port bow. 25 October.
8. "Zeke", which made "suicide dive" on SUWANNEE approaches over fantail. This is crash of 25 October.
9. "Zeke" is almost intercepted by SUWANNEE F6F, guns firing. Directly below "Zeke" (right hand side of picture) is 5-inch burst.
10. F6F (Ensign Lindskog) is closer but so is "Zeke" to SUWANNEE. Note bomb under fuselage, and increasing AA from SUWANNEE. A few seconds later plane hit just forward of after elevator.
11. First of six pictures showing effect of crash dive on SUWANNEE flight deck. 250 kilogram bomb has just exploded between flight and hangar decks and fire billows out. 25 October.
12. Second of six. Men climb out of catwalk to fight fire.
13. Third. Note propeller in air. It has been blown through steel bulkhead. Note men in water, blown from hangar deck.
14. Fourth of six. Force of explosion is diminishing. TBM aft of the elevator, loaded with torpedo, is uninjured.
15. Fifth. Smoke clears from deck and gunners.

16. Sixth. Back to normal. Fire and damage is confined to hangar deck.
17. Flight deck one and one-half hours later. Hole is patched and ship is ready to land aircraft. Note that only four wires, instead of eight, are being used. All landings were made without mishap.
18. 26 October. The second "Zeke" suicide plane comes in at 45° dive.
19. "Zeke" is closer. A second later it crashed on forward elevator, its bomb exploding on contact, destroying elevator and doing severe damage to bridge and personnel there. Picture taken from the bridge.
20. Bomb and fuze fragments found from attack of 26 October. Note absence of arming wire in fuze.
21. Another view of bomb and fuze fragments.
22. Forward elevator damage. In upper right, hole from explosion of second bomb, probably dropped by a dive-bomber, which exploded one to three minutes after first explosion.
23. Another view of damage of 26 October. Hole over catapult, port bow forward of smashed elevator. Note wrecked 40 mm battery in background.
24. Clean-up a few hours after the fire had been subdued. 26 October.
25. Bulkhead on starboard side of hangar deck has been blown out by explosion of 25 October.
26. Picture shows hangar deck sagging onto main deck and damage on main deck from 25 October attack.
27. Another view of main deck damage.
28. Repairs begin on flight deck hole, 25 October.
29. Remains of "Zeke" engine which penetrated through flight and hangar decks to main deck.
30. Wardroom becomes a temporary Sick Bay.
31. And also a morgue. 25 October.
